WINHEC and its member organizations

Established at the World Indigenous Peoples Conference: Education in 2002, WINHEC has a membership that represents many Indigenous Nations and education institutions in eight countries – Alaska; Aotearoa; Australia; Canada; Hawaii; Norway; Taiwan and USA. In their collective concerns for the rights of Indigenous people to access all levels of education and to address the barriers that impeded respectful engagement of Indigenous peoples in teaching, research and other endeavors in education, the founding members determined that the goals and objectives of WINHEC must align with the goals and objectives of international instruments.

These include the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous People (UNDRIP); the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights; the International Declaration on Human Rights; and other international documents of note designed to protect and promote the sovereign rights of Indigenous Peoples.



WINHEC Practice Handbook and Organization Framework- was approved at the 2021 AGM.

The WINHEC Practice Handbook was presented by the WINHEC Executive Board to the Governors for consideration and was approve unanimously. A copy of the Constitution and/or Practice Handbook is available upon request.



We acknowledge Dr. Keiki Kawai'ae'a and Dr. Walter Kahumoku III in their amazing work to bring the highest quality accreditation process to our indigenous communities to ensure our educational sovereignty. They continue to make solid progress in this process even at a time when site visits are impossible to execute. Their commitment to WINHEC Accreditation is exemplary. The BoA met in February as interest has increased in seeking accreditation from WINHEC. A new BoA handbook and policies are currently being developed by the board. World Indigenous Nations University (WINU)

Rongo Wetere is in the process of establishing a 'Not-For Profit' status for WINU which was supported by the WINHEC Executive Committee on April 21-22, meeting. Also, WIRA and the WINHEC Journal will be moving under WINU's administration. This has been discussed for several years, and we finally make decision on Tuesday August 16 during the Executive Committee meeting where detailed information will be presented to the AGM.

Unfortunately, due to the limitations of the software we use for the WINHEC website, we were unable to achieve this. Having a standalone WINU website will give WINU more flexibility to provide their current and prospective students the service they deserve. So, as Eddie was unable to commit to build a standalone WINU website, it was decided to hand this over to a third-party developer Andrew Forward.

Eddie also connected with a third-party software provider called Pacxa based in Hawaii to get WINHEC setup with a Microsoft 365 subscription. Initially we have a limited number of licences, but we want to set this platform up so that we can better collaborate, share key documents, and all meet using Microsoft Teams.
