In the spirit and intent of the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, the WINU Executive is calling for nominations from WINU Member Countries to celebrate and honour the contributions of outstanding individuals who through their teachings, research, scholarship, advocacy and influence in social policy and Indigenous education have made exceptional contributions at the community, national and/or international levels for the advancement of higher education for Indigenous Nations.

Nomination forms should be submitted to the WINU Honorary Doctorate Review Committee for the following honours:

- 1. Honorary Doctorate to Indigenous Educators or Indigenous-serving Educators EdD (Doctor of Education); and
- 2. Honorary Doctorate to Indigenous Elders/Knowledge Holders EdD (Doctor of Education for Indigenous Knowledge & Development).

Those nominated for these prestigious credentials are considered worthy individuals for their many years of service to the protection, preservation and progression of Indigenous education at the community, local, national and/or international level.

WINU Honorary Doctorate Regulations WINU CONSTITUTION

Section 7(b) and (C) of the WINU Constitution sets out the following rules and processes applicable to awarding honorary doctorates.

"To confer on the recommendation of the Education Regions and the WINU Honours Secretariat":

- (a) Honorary Doctorate to Indigenous Educators or Indigenous-serving that is earned through life long academic endeavours for the benefit of Indigenous peoples at the community, nationally and/or international level.
- (b) Honorary Doctorate to Indigenous Elders/Knowledge Holders of member countries."

THE PROCESS

To make all applications comparable, the following information is required:

A. Honorary Doctorate to Indigenous Educators or Indigenous-serving Educators – Doctor of Education (EdD) for Indigenous Education

It is recommended that the candidate be:

- Male or female, at least 50 years of age or older;
- Has served as an outstanding educator for over 30 years locally, nationally or internationall;
- Has served as a leader of an education institution both nationally and internationally;
- Has been influential nationally and internationally regarding Indigenous education;
- Is well supported by their own community; and
- Supported (in writing) by at least three community members.

B. Honorary Doctorate to Indigenous Elders/Knowledge Holders – Doctor of Education (EdD) for Indigenous Knowledge and Development

It is accepted that Indigenous Elders are those considered as such by their community, age 50 or older, and is recognized as a keeper/holder of traditional knowledge despite their age – male or female.

Nominees are recognised by his/her community as a keeper/holder of Indigenous knowledge, and has freely shared this knowledge with the community, and has helped to interpret this knowledge into everyday usage to the Indigenous community, in particular. This person is acknowledged and admired by his/her own people and many of the young and old have sought their advice on Indigenous matters. This person may or may not have been recognised by local universities as a keeper/holder of Indigenous knowledge. It is important, however, that the local Indigenous people hold them in high regard and respect. Again, the application should be supported (in writing) by at least three community members.

(Please Note: Because of the positions they hold, the Chancellor and the Deputy Chancellor will not be able to support any nominations for any WINU Honorary Doctorate.)

All nominations for the 2019 WINU Honorary Doctorate degrees will be processed in accordance to the following timeline:

- a. **March 30, 2019.** Nominations submitted to WINU by Country/Nation/State representatives by email to **peter@winuhp.com**.
- b. **April 30, 2019-8.** Recipients confirmed by the WINU Honorary Doctorate Review Committee for recommendation to WINU Executive;
- c. July 31, 2019 August 5, 2019. Awards Conferral held during the 2019 WINHEC/WINU Annual General Meeting, scheduled for Hualien, Taiwan. More information to come. If Awardee is not able to attend in person, arrangements can be made for In-Country Award Ceremony.
